# MOMBIN CROCHU, HAITI

VPI partners with Mombin Crochu Hospital to support the hospital, the malnutrition program for infants and toddlers, clean water initiatives, mobile clinics, vaccination programs, and more in Mombin Crochu, Haiti. In 2025 VPI again funded a group of 17 Haitian medical personnel to travel to the hospital for 1 week and perform surgery, give medical expertise and support public health initiatives. Food insecurity has become a major problem with the political conditions of this past year, and VPI has reached out to address this as political unrest continues producing untold suffering and loss.

**70-75 individuals reached weekly**




